


#### **Fund Protection**



- ☐ The fund should be permanent.
  - It should help educate children of today and tomorrow.
- ☐ Founding Fathers had concerns about concentration of power.
  - Did not want Governor or Legislature to control the fund
- Solution written into Article X of Wisconsin Constitution:
  - Created "Board of Commissioners of Public Lands"
  - Comprised of 3 separate constitutional officers.
    - ✓ Attorney General should know about law
    - ✓ State Treasurer should know about money
    - ✓ Secretary of State should know about keeping records

# BCPL STATE TRUST FUND LOAN PROGRAM Created and Authorized by State Legislature in 1871

- Eligible Borrowers to include Wisconsin Municipalities and School Districts
- Goals:
  - 1. Simple Alternative to Bonding for Borrowers
  - 2. Prudent investment for the trust funds
    - low risk with reasonable rate of return

BCPL State Trust Fund Loan Program has been a success by any measure:


- 1. No defaults in 149 year history GREAT customers!


## Simple Approval Process



- **□** Loan Approval Process
  - Simple Request Form, included in Packet (www.bcpl.wisconsin.gov)
  - Easy Fill-In-The-Blank Application, includes Borrower Resolution
  - Fast Approval (average time to fund is 30-45 days, record = 17 days)
- **☐** Following Approval
  - Four Months to Draw Funds
  - No review of plans/invoices/expenditures
- ☐ How is it possible to maintain this <u>Simple Process</u> and Have <u>NO Defaults</u>?
  - ☐ BCPL retains right to audit borrowers
  - ☐ BCPL relies on borrower compliance with Statutes
- □ Consider the 1881 penalty for using Trust Fund loan dollars on something other than the approved loan purpose....

6 to 10 Years	Strong deals will qualify for

21 to 30 years	than G.O.

## Oneida County

- 1. County borrowed funds on GO basis from BCPL
- 2. County re-lent those funds to Oneida County Economic Development Corporation (OCEDC)
- 3. OCEDC purchased property, build-to-suit facility
- 4. Long-term lease from manufacturer flows backs through OCEDC and County to BCPL

#### Two separate projects:

ABX – plastic film producer employs ~60 (Omaha Steaks).

Expera Specialty Solutions –  $2^{nd}$  location required by Boeing for specialty paper used in carbon fiber process. Supported hundreds of jobs at location #1, created ~20 jobs at location #2, renovated the empty Print-Pak building.





# Town of Rome (Adams County)


- 1. Town borrowed \$12 million on G.O. basis from BCPL.
- 2. Loan funded an economic development incentive for the construction of the Sand Valley Golf Resort. Opened in May 2017 and was named Best New Course by both Golf Magazine and Golf Digest.
- 3. Success of this project is illustrated by the subsequent need to expand the nearby airport in Wisconsin Rapids to accommodate the number of private aircraft carrying guests to Sand Valley.





# Mount Pleasant (Racine County)

- 1. Village borrowed \$20 million as interim construction financing for TID infrastructure.
- 2. Village sold bonds last week. Proceeds to payoff BCPL and fund additional infrastructure.
- 3. BCPL utilized for speed, flexibility on re-payment schedule, No Fees.





## Village of Fall Creek (Eau Claire County)

- Requested revenue loan on new TID (common).
- But BCPL is risk averse no revenue loan until the cash flow is proven available.

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- Village borrowed funds on GO basis from BCPL for initial TID infrastructure construction.
- Following construction of new facility and confirmation of assessment by DOR, BCPL refinanced own GO loan with revenue loan.
- Political Decision that restored borrowing capacity.
